

Fall Clean Up

Autumn is the time homeowners clean and put away summer toys. When storing your larger toys please keep the following in mind.

Campers, boats, and utility trailers that are 25 feet (25') or less may be parked only in a side or rear yard on an improved surface. An "improved surface" is defined as a surface construction of concrete, blacktop or paving stone which is complete and uninterrupted underneath all portions of the vehicle being placed on the surface.

Vehicles, such as those described above, may be parked in the front yard driveway for a period not to exceed a total period of time (whether continuous or in the aggregate) of seventy two (72) hours for the sole purpose of loading and unloading such vehicles within any given fourteen (14) day period.

Autumn is a beautiful season, brilliant mums bloom, jack-o-lanterns smile, scarecrows wave a friendly hello and the trees display a collage of reds, yellows, and oranges. With winter around the corner the warm colors of fall are truly a spectacle to be enjoyed. However, when the trees tire of their color and begin to drop their leaves and prepare for a long winter sleep, the work of a homeowner seems never ending. Rake, rake, rake, and what to do with all those leaves?

The Village does not at this time does not provide leaf removal service. Please do not rake leaves into the street. Doing so creates a drainage problem. Leaves in the gutter impede the flow of water and collect and block the storm sewer inlets.

Leaves can be placed in brown paper yard waste bags or in a rigid container clearly marked landscape waste and placed out on your regular refuse day for pickup by Waste Management through the last refuse pick up in November.

You are allowed to burn leaves, however, burning is allowed only during the hours of 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. with a wind of less than 10 mph. All fires must be attended at all times by a person of at least 18 years of age. **Fires must be fully extinguished if not attended and by 6 p.m.** Please be considerate of your neighbors when burning. Don't burn leaves when they are wet and please don't burn on nice days when windows may be open – remember some people are adversely affected by the smoke in the air.
