Happy New Year!



The Village of Sugar Grove is ready to ring in 2019, but before doing so we would like to take a moment to reflect on some of the significant accomplishments from the past year.

2018 saw the Village welcome MetroNet, Inc. as a new TV and internet service provider after working for several years to bring this much needed option to the community. Residents in some areas are already enjoying the benefits of this service and construction continues to expand coverage in the Village.

October 2018 saw the approval of an intergovernmental agreement by the Illinois Tollway Board for the construction of the interchange project at I-88 and IL Route 47. Construction for the new, full-access interchange, which will provide greater access into the Sugar Grove community and support economic development opportunities along Route 47, will begin in 2019 with completion expected by the end of the year.

In addition, ground was broken on Chelsea Meadows Senior Apartments, Anytime Fitness opened its doors for business and construction on the extension of the water main between Settlers Ridge and Prestbury subdivisions, which ensures sufficient fire flow in case of an emergency, began.

The Village is not slowing down in the new year as staff continues to work with developers on some exciting future developments for the community. Keep watching the Village website, Facebook page and newsletter for updates.



Village Offices Closed on New Year's Day

The Village of Sugar Grove Village Hall and Public Works facility will be closed in observation of New Year's Day on Tuesday, January 1, 2019.

Normal business hours will resume Wednesday, January 2.

After-hour bill payments can be made via the Village after-hours drop box located at the entrance of Village Hall, 10 S. Municipal Drive.

Trash collection will be delayed one day.



Kane County residents are now able to dial 211 to access information on local human services made available by government, non-profit and faith-based organizations in Kane County. The service provides callers with free and confidential assistance with needs such as emergency shelter, food, employment and health care.

Winter Snow Operations

The Public Works Department works hard to keep residents safe during the winter driving season. In addition to plowing, Public Works crews use an anti-icing program. Crews custom-blend the mixture for each snowstorm based on projected pavement and air temperatures and wind speeds to efficiently slow roadway icing.

This mixture is applied to roads up to 48 hours before it snows, and can be seen in longitudinal stripes along the pavement. It is applied again directly to the rock salt just prior to distributing the salt onto the roadway. When applied to the rock salt, the liquid mixture helps the rock salt activate and work in colder temperatures, plus reduces how much the salt bounces when it hits the pavement.

The anti-icing system has several benefits. Most importantly, it helps crews remove snow and ice from the pavement faster and at lower temperatures. Second, it reduces the average amount of salt applied during each storm by 15 to 20 percent – that saves money and is good for the environment.

Remember to Recycle Right

Industry data shows that one in four items placed in recycling totes is not actually recyclable. Although we may want all of our waste to be recyclable, much is not. Wrong items in a recycling tote can cause a batch of otherwise good materials to go to the landfill.

To recycle right, focus on recycling common items such as metal cans, plastic bottles and jugs, glass bottles and jars, and clean cardboard and paper. If you are not sure if an item can be recycled, put it in the trash to avoid contamination.

Visibility from within snowplows is limited. Keep a safe distance, and remind children to also keep away from plows, including building snow forts away from streets.

Don't park on snow-covered streets. Parking is prohibited on Village streets when two inches (2") or more snow has accumulated. Keeping cars off the streets helps Village crews clear the roads faster and prevents your car from being plowed in. Street parking is allowed again once the snow stops and the streets have been plowed curb to curb.

Although plow drivers take care to selectively place snow, sometimes snow must be placed at intersections. Help keep yourself and your neighbors safe by shoveling curb ramps. Shovel sidewalks and dig out hydrants. Shoveling, plowing, or blowing snow into public streets causes driving hazards and is prohibited by Village ordinance. Keep garbage cans and recycling totes out of the street so the plows do not hit them.

Acceptable Recycling Tote Materials

- Metal Cans and Foil
- Plastic Bottles, Jugs and Tubs
- Office Paper, Newspaper and Magazines
- Paper Cardboard, Dairy and Juice Containers
- Flattened Cardboard and Paperboard
- Glass Bottles and Jars

Not Acceptable Materials

- Food Waste
- Plastic Bags and Film
(*may be recycled at Jewel stores*)
- Styrofoam Containers and Cups
- Plastic Clamshell Containers (Berry, Salad and Baked Goods Containers)
- Tissues, Paper Towels and Napkins
- Tanglers (Hangers, Wires, Cords)
- Medical Waste
- Electronics, Household Hazardous Waste and Batteries (DC Recycling has special pickup days for these items. Visit www.sugargroveil.gov to learn more and schedule a pickup.)

Christmas Tree Pickup

DC Recycling Systems will collect Christmas trees on your normal pickup day January 7 thru January 29.

Trees must be free of decorations, including tinsel. Flocked trees will not be accepted. Trees cannot be in a plastic bag. Trees longer than 6 feet must be cut into smaller pieces.
